

UMC TRAUMA CENTER


- In 2021 -
 - Treated over 13,000 patients
 - Admitted 5,000 with 30% having an ISS>15
 - 80% blunt and 20% penetrating
- Serves a 10,000 square mile area across 4 states
- Nevada's only Level 1 Adult Trauma Center
- Nevada's only Pediatric Trauma Center
- Nevada's only ABA-verified Burn Center
- Nevada's only Transplant Center
- Children's Hospital "within a hospital"

TRAUMA RESUS

- 11 bed resuscitation unit separate from adult and pediatric ERs
- Staffed by ER physician and trauma team 24/7
- Dedicated CT scanner and IR suite
- 3 Trauma operating rooms
- Blood refrigerator in Resus with pRBCs and FFP
- Helipad on roof


