ACS/AAST International Scholarship 2018

Purpose

This scholarship will be awarded to surgeons specifically working in acute care surgery: trauma and emergency general surgery in countries other than the U.S. and Canada to improve the quality of acute care surgical services. Preference will be given to applicants from developing nations. The scholarship, in the amount of \$5,000, provides the scholar with an opportunity to attend the annual meeting of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (AAST) and to visit one or two Level I Trauma Centers and/or the Trauma Quality Improvement Program (TOIP) headquarters at the American College of Surgeons in Chicago, IL, to learn about the standards for a trauma program/database and the importance of multidisciplinary Acute Care surgery care.

The awardee will receive gratis registration to the annual meeting of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma and to one available postgraduate course at the meeting. Assistance will be provided to obtain preferential housing in economical hotels in the AAST meeting and Trauma Center/TQIP cities. Hotel and travel expenses will be the responsibility of the awardee, to be funded from the scholarship award.

In order to qualify for consideration by the selection committee, all of the requirements must be fulfilled.

All applications for the year 2018 and all of the supporting documentation must be received by the International Liaison no later than **March 15, 2018**, in order for an applicant to receive consideration by the selection committee. All applicants will be notified of the selection committee's decision in May 2018. Applicants are urged to submit their completed applications and supporting documents as early as possible in order to provide sufficient time for processing.

Basic Requirements

- Applicants must be graduates of schools of medicine who have completed their surgical training and are practicing attending surgeons.
- Applicants must be members in good standing of both the American College of Surgeons (Associate Fellow or Fellow) and the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (Active or Associate Member).
- Applicants must be at least 30 years old, but under 50, on the date that the complete application is filed.
- Applications will be accepted for processing only when the applicants have been in surgical practice, teaching, or research for a minimum of one year at their intended permanent location, following completion of all formal training (including fellowships and scholarships).
- Applicants must show evidence of commitment to high-quality acute care surgery, to surgical teaching, and to improving access to surgical care in their community.
- Applicants must submit a fully completed application form, located on the ACS website, facs.org. The application and accompanying materials must be prepared using a computer and submitted in English. Submission of a curriculum vitae only is not acceptable.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have not already experienced training or surgical fellowships in the U.S. or Canada.
- Unsuccessful applicants may reapply only twice and only by completing and submitting a current application form provided by the College together with new supporting documentation.

Applicants must submit independently prepared letters of recommendation from three of their colleagues. One letter must be from the chair of the department in which they hold a clinical or academic appointment or from a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons residing in their country. The Chair's or the Fellow's letter is to directly address the applicant's commitment to high-quality acute care surgery, surgical teaching, and improving access to acute care surgery locally. The other two letters of recommendation should be from colleagues who can address the applicant's acute care surgical, clinical, and teaching abilities and practice. Letters of recommendation should be submitted by the individuals making the recommendation.

- The scholarship must be used in the year for which it is designated. It cannot be postponed.
- Awardees are expected to provide a written report upon their return home, specifically focusing on the value of the visit to the awardee and the potential beneficial effect to the acute care surgical patients in the country of origin.
- All applications for the year 2018 and all of the supporting documentation must be received by the ACS International Liaison no later than March 15, 2018, in order for an applicant to receive consideration by the selection committee. All applicants will be notified of the selection committee's decision in May 2018. Applicants are urged to submit their completed applications and supporting documents as early as possible in order to provide sufficient time for processing.

Application requirements consist of the following items, in this order, submitted as a single PDF document to scholarships@facs.org no later than the application deadline of March 15, 2018:

- Application form, to be completed online
- Essay of no more than two pages stating how the applicant fulfills the requirements and his/her reason for applying for the fellowship
- A current curriculum vitae up to 10 pages in length, including medical school, postdoctoral education, and current and past hospital appointments

In addition, **three letters of recommendation are required** and should be submitted to scholarships@facs.org by the individuals making the recommendations. Please visit *facs.org/member-services/scholarships/international* for recommendation guidelines. It is to the applicant's advantage to submit the completed application as early as possible in advance of the closing date, March 15, 2018.
